

FINANCIAL AID AT NORTH CENTRAL TEXAS COLLEGE

North Central Texas College administers a variety of programs for students who need assistance in financing their education. Among the programs available are grants, scholarships, and part-time employment funded through federal, state, and local sources.

WHO QUALIFIES?

In general, eligibility for financial assistance at North Central Texas College is based exclusively upon demonstrated need, excluding most scholarship programs. Understandably, demonstrated need varies greatly from one individual to another. Therefore, each student is responsible for informing the College of their need for financial assistance. In addition, each student must provide all information necessary in order to establish the individual qualifications for such assistance.

The following table is offered as an aid to students in comparing costs of attending school at North Central Texas College to personal financial resources. Although, prospective students should keep in mind, these figures are estimates and should only be used as a guide in determining relative financial need as it applies to a prospective financial aid application at NCTC.

TUITION & FEE RATES

Your tuition is calculated by multiplying the number of **semester (credit) hours** for which you're enrolled times a tuition rate which is determined according to your place of residence. The total amount of tuition you'll be charged is based on two things: (1) the total number of semester hours (see note below) for which you're enrolled, and (2) your permanent, legal **place of residence** (hometown). The per-hour tuition rates for each of the three basic residency categories are as follows:

Although financial aid is available for most students with demonstrated need, students must

make application first before being given an award. Again, it is the student's responsibility to inform the College of need and to supply information necessary to establish eligibility.

APPLICATION AND ELIGIBILITY

Students wanting to apply for financial assistance at North Central Texas College should go to the Financial Aid Office and request a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and a General Information Form. FAFSA applications must be mailed to the processor at the U.S. Department of Education. You can submit an application on-line by going to: <<http://www.fafsa.edu.gov>>.

Return the General Information Form to the Financial Aid Office. It is possible that additional information may be required from the student before a file is rendered complete; additional information is dependent on the results of the student's FAFSA. All financial assistance eligibility is established from the information submitted on the student's FAFSA application. All students receiving Title IV financial aid must be a regular degree-seeking student and have the ability to benefit.

FINANCIAL AID DISTRIBUTION

Once a student is deemed eligible for financial assistance, distribution of awards is based on an evaluation of individual needs. Actual awards may be made up of a combination of various aid programs known as "financial aid packaging" to meet the varying needs of individual students.

Tuition and fees will be paid from grant awards each semester at registration for those meeting published deadlines. Remaining amounts of grant awards will be disbursed after classes begin. Eligible students not meeting deadlines will receive their disbursements as soon as eligibility is verified and funds are available.

SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS POLICY

Financial aid recipients are required by law to maintain satisfactory academic progress as defined by the College. Non-compliance may result in disqualification for further financial aid assistance. Copies of the minimum standards of progress necessary to maintain eligibility are available from the Office of Financial Aid. Call 940-668-4242 for information regarding eligibility requirements, application procedures, or specific award programs.

APPLICATION DEADLINES

In order to receive funds to cover institutional expenses for the fall semester, financial aid applications, as outlined above are due on May 1st. Note that a completed financial aid file includes correct processed results from the student's Free Application for Federal Student Aid as reported to NCTC and all required supporting documentation. Please be aware that from the time a FASA is submitted, it takes at least six weeks to process and complete a student's financial aid file.

Completed financial aid applications will be accepted and processed past the May 1 deadlines however; *students whose applications are incomplete after July 1 must be prepared to pay their own tuition, fees, and books at registration.* Eligible students who do not meet deadlines must wait to receive disbursements after registration ends and classes begin, according to availability of funds.

FALL SEMESTER LATE AWARDS – Late awards will be disbursed during the fall semester for students whose applications were completed prior to published final exam dates. Students with incomplete applications by these dates will not receive award disbursements for fall until enrolled and attending as an eligible student the following spring semester.

SPRING SEMESTER AWARDS – In order to receive funds to cover institutional expenses for the spring semester, completed applications must be received by November 1st. All completed applications submitted after November 1st will be accepted subject to available funds prior to published final examinations dates.

SUMMER SEMESTER AWARDS – Because summer trails the preceding award year, financial aid is generally limited. Need-based work-study employment may be awarded if funds are available. Both summer terms will be combined as one semester for determining enrollment status and grant eligibility. Eligibility is based on remaining unmet need from the application processed for the previous fall and spring semesters.

STUDENT FINANCIAL AID RETURN OF TITLE IV AID POLICY

A student receiving financial aid affirms that any funds received under the Federal Pell Grant, the Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant or the Federal Work-Study Program will be used solely for expenses related to attendance or continued attendance at North Central Texas College.

Return of Federal Title IV Funds

North Central Texas College refunds unearned funds received from Federal student assistance programs in accordance with Federal Title IV student assistance regulations, with rules of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, and the rules of the College's Board of Regents.

The student receiving assistance from Federal Title IV programs is required to complete a minimum number of hours for which assistance was received. If the student completely withdraws from school during the semester, or quits attending but fails to officially withdraw, the student may be required to return the unearned part of the funds received to help pay educational expenses for the term. All students who owe Federal and/or NCTC funds will not be allowed to re-enroll at NCTC until the funds have been repaid. Liability for the return of Federal Title IV funds will be determined according to the following guidelines:

1. If the student remains enrolled and attends class beyond the 60% mark of the semester in which aid is received, all federal aid is considered earned and not subject to this policy.
2. If the student completely withdraws from all classes prior to completing 60% of the semester, a pro-rated portion of the federal aid received must be returned to the federal aid programs based on the amount of time the student attended.
3. If the student does not officially withdraw from classes but quits attending all classes, a prorated portion of the federal aid received, based on the documented last date of attendance, must be returned to the federal programs. If the College is unable to document the last date of attendance, the school will assume the student only attended to the 50% mark of the semester and this date will be used to determine how much aid must be returned.

Return of Federal Title IV funds will be distributed according to statutory regulations. Worksheets provided by the U.S. Department of Education will be used to determine the amounts and order of return. The student will be notified and will be allowed 45 days from the date of determination to return their share to the program accounts. If the student does not return the amount owed within 45 days, the amount of the overpayment will be reported to the U.S. Department of Education (DOE) via the National Student Loan Database (NSLDS) and the student

will be referred to the DOE for resolution of the debt. Contact Financial Aid for questions and examples of this policy Return of Federal Title IV funds will be distributed according to statutory regulations. The student will be notified and will be allowed 45 days from the date of determination to return their share to the program accounts. SCHOLARSHIPS

The North Central Texas College Foundation annually awards more than 180 scholarships. These scholarships are made available through the generous contributions of individuals, corporations and private foundations to assist students in reaching their educational goals. Scholarships also are available through several student organizations and other sources.

Foundation scholarships are generally awarded on the basis of academic achievement and/or financial need. All scholarships carry their own eligibility requirements and restrictions, which are based on conditions proposed by the scholarship donor.

Students may request a scholarship application and handbook from the NCTC Foundation Office, Room 309, or Financial Aid Office, Room 154 on the Gainesville Campus; the Student Services Office at the Corinth Campus; or the Counseling Office at the Bowie Campus. Application deadlines are April 15 for the fall semester and October 15 for the spring semester.

All scholarships, except as otherwise indicated, require full-time (12 hours) status. Each academic year students must reapply for NCTC Foundation Scholarships. The dollar amount of a scholarship may change based on available funds.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS AVAILABLE TO NCTC STUDENTS

The chart below outlines the major financial aid programs available at North Central Texas College along with eligibility requirements and application procedures. This is not a complete list; students should check with the Financial Aid Office for new or specialized scholarship programs that may be available.

SCHOLARSHIPS AT NORTH CENTRAL TEXAS COLLEGE

The scholarship program administered by North Central Texas College and the North Central Texas College Foundation are generally awarded on the basis of academic achievement and/or financial need. All scholarships carry their own eligibility requirements and restrictions, which are based on college policy, or the conditions imposed by scholarship donors. Each scholarship description gives information concerning eligibility requirements, restrictions, amount, and origin.

Both new students and current students enrolling at North Central Texas College are encouraged to complete an application for NCTC scholarship awards. New students must have submitted an application for admission to the College.

While efforts are made to provide current scholarship information in this handbook, all scholarship programs listed here are subject to change without notice. North Central Texas College reserves the right to limit, delay or discontinue the awarding of scholarships described in this handbook due to the availability of funds or other factors deemed in the best interest of the College or the North Central Texas College Foundation.

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Students who wish to be considered for scholarships at North Central Texas College should follow these general guidelines when submitting applications.

1. Applicants must have made application for admission to North Central Texas College. Applicants must be eligible for admission to NCTC in accordance with existing policies found in the current *General Catalog*.
2. Students must be enrolled or plan to enroll as a full-time student at North Central Texas College unless stated otherwise in this *Scholarship Handbook*.
3. Fulfill and maintain the grade point average (GPA) requirements of the scholarships for which you are making application.
4. **High school seniors must submit an official high school transcript, which includes grades, estimated class rank and ACT or SAT scores.**
5. **Currently enrolled college students and transfer students must submit transcripts of all prior college course work.**
6. Applicants must submit letters of recommendation, portfolios, or other necessary materials required of the scholarships listed in this *Scholarship Handbook* for

which you are applying. Regarding scholarships that are need based, attach any and all materials that show financial need.

7. Carefully complete the scholarship application, making sure to answer all questions to the best of your ability. ***Incomplete applications will not be considered.***

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION DEADLINES

Unless specifically stated, the deadline for applying for general scholarships awarded for the **fall semester** is **April 15**. The deadline for the **spring semester** is **October 15**.

General NCTC Scholarships

MARY JOSEPHINE COX

These awards are provided by the estate of Mary Josephine Cox, a lifelong resident of Cooke County. The Cox scholarships are applicable to cover tuition and fees up to \$100 per semester. To be eligible to receive this scholarship, an applicant must be a resident of Cooke County and less than twenty-one years of age at the time of registration. Also:

1. Establish residency by meeting one of the three following conditions;
 - a. Be a resident of Cooke County for purposes other than higher education for a minimum of sixty days,
 - b. Be a graduate of a Cooke County high school, or
 - c. The student or parent owns real property in Cooke County
2. An applicant must have a cumulative 80 percent scholastic average in high

school or an overall college GPA of 3.0. College GPA will be based on the completion of nine college credit hours.

3. An applicant must remain enrolled for twelve (12) semester hours or more in a long semester. A recipient may continue to receive awards, without additional applications, for five consecutive long semesters or until graduation from North Central Texas College, whichever comes first, provided the semester hour enrollment and GPA requirement continue to be met.
4. The scholarship applies to tuition and fees only. The award does not cover late or schedule change fees. The maximum award is \$100 per semester.
5. Special competency awards must show a direct contribution to NCTC in such areas as choir, band, athletics and student activities.
6. Awards are based on scholarship, special need, and special competency; however, awards for special competency are not given for summer school.

VALEDICTORIAN SCHOLARSHIP

The State of Texas awards a full-tuition and fee scholarship to the valedictorian of each graduating class from accredited Texas high schools, provided that the individual enrolls in a state-supported college or university immediately following graduation. The Valedictorian's Scholarship is awarded for both the fall and spring semesters of the student's freshman year. Eligible students, certified by the Texas Education Agency, should contact the NCTC Business Office to obtain this tuition/fee exemption at the beginning of the fall semester.

NCTC Foundation Scholarships

North Central Texas College Foundation administers a number of scholarships, which are not limited to a specific major or field of study. These scholarships are open to all eligible students. **Unless otherwise stated, all NCTC Foundation Scholarships require a minimum of a 2.0 GPA.**

ALMARIE FIELD

This scholarship is set-aside for students who have been out of high school three years or more. Recipients must have earned either a B or C average in their senior year of high school. Recipients must not be receiving any other scholarships.

Mr. & Mrs. Stan Field established this scholarship in memory of his mother. Their desire was to award scholarships to students who may not normally qualify for scholarships, but who show potential and determination to receive an education.

AMERICAN PETROLEUM INSTITUTE TEXOMA CHAPTER

This scholarship is restricted to residents of Cooke County. Recipients must maintain a GPA of 2.5 but is not limited to a specific field of study. Scholarship award amount is \$250 per semester and was established through the hard work and generosity of the members of the Texoma Chapter of the American Petroleum Institute.

BESSIE CORPIER

These scholarships are reserved for students enrolled in either academic or vocational programs. Preference will be given to Callisburg ISD and Valley View ISD graduates. Scholarship award amounts are \$250 per semester.

Ms. Corpier said, "I believe all students should continue their

education past high school, and I just want this scholarship to make a difference for someone, to go on to college and get a good start."

BILL CYPERT MEMORIAL

This scholarship is reserved for residents of Cooke County. Recipients must maintain a 2.0 GPA. The scholarship award amount is \$250 per semester.

The First State Bank of Gainesville established this scholarship in honor of Bill Cypert.

BOYD & NAOMI WARE

This scholarship is reserved for a student who is a resident of Cooke County and a U.S. citizen. Recipients must fulfill and maintain good academic standing by earning a minimum college cumulative grade point average of 2.0. Scholarship award amount is \$300 per semester.

Boyd and Naomi Ware hoped to encourage students to attend NCTC and to strive to achieve a college degree.

CARL ZIMMERER MEMORIAL

This scholarship is for students who work hard to obtain a college degree. Preference will be given to a student who struggles to maintain academic progress because of a learning disability, such as dyslexia. Recipients must maintain a cumulative 2.0 GPA. Scholarship award amount is \$300 per semester.

CLOVA DAVIS SCHENK

This award seeks to increase the educational opportunities for the more mature student. Preference will be given to students over the age of forty. Recipients must maintain a GPA of 2.5. Scholarship award amount is \$300 per semester. Mr. Schenk established this scholarship in memory of his wife.

**COOKE COUNTY CITIZEN BAND
RADIO CLUB**

This scholarship is reserved for legal residents of Cooke County. Preference will be given to applicants who are computer science or communications majors. Scholarship award amount is limited to the fall semester in the amount of \$250.

**COOKE COUNTY MASONIC
LODGES**

This scholarship is set-aside for Cooke County residents. Recipients must be enrolled full-time (12 semester hours) and must maintain a GPA of 3.0. Scholarship award amount is \$250 per semester.

Funds for this scholarship were raised by the five Cooke County Masonic Lodges. The purpose of the scholarship is to provide financial assistance to students seeking the goal of higher education.

CORA STANIFORTH

These awards are restricted to graduates of Gainesville High School. Additionally, recipients must be 21 years of age or older, satisfactorily working towards a degree, must not have earned more than 62 college credit hours or have received any college level degree. Scholarship award amounts are \$250 per semester.

D. W. ATKINS

This scholarship is geared to the academically talented student. Recipients must maintain a 3.0 GPA. Scholarship amount is \$250 per semester.

EARL B. "RUSTY" HADLOCK

This scholarship has only one restriction; a student must fulfill and maintain a 2.0 GPA. Scholarship award amount is \$250 per semester.

This scholarship was established in memory of Earl B "Rusty"

Hadlock through donations from family and friends.

**FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF
SAINT JO**

This scholarship is reserved for a student who is a graduating senior with a "B" or better average from Muenster ISD, Forestburg ISD, or Sacred Heart Academy. Scholarship award amount is \$300 each semester.

The First National Bank of Saint Jo is strongly committed to assuring educational opportunities to students in their business area.

FLORENCE ESTES

These scholarships are reserved for deserving Cooke County residents. Scholarship award amounts are \$200 per semester.

In 1967, Ms. Estes provided for a scholarship in her will. Her goal was to promote higher education to the residents of Cooke County. Each year NCTC makes her wish come true with the awarding of these scholarships.

FRANCES ANN SPAETH

Frances Ann Spaeth established this scholarship provide financial assistance to deserving students. Recipients must maintain a GPA of 2.5. Scholarship award amount is \$250 per semester.

GAINESVILLE KIWANIS CLUB

This award is for residents of Cooke County who exhibit strong involvement in community service projects. Preference will be given to students who are already involved with the Kiwanis family. Recipients must maintain a GPA of 2.0 and must attend at least one Kiwanis Club meeting per semester to inform the members of his/her educational goals and accomplishments. Scholarship award amount is \$300 per semester

The Gainesville Kiwanis Club has long been involved with North Central Texas College and realizes

the value of education. The establishment of this scholarship is their way of providing a helping hand to NCTC students.

GAINESVILLE OPTIMIST CLUB

This scholarship is reserved for Cooke County residents and graduates of a Cooke County High School. Scholarship award amount is \$200 per semester. The Gainesville Optimist Club established this scholarship as a way to assist the youth of Cooke County.

GENERAL ACADEMIC

These scholarships are for academically talented students but are not limited to any specific field of study. Scholarship award amounts are \$250 per semester and were established by a variety of donors from the community seeking to provide an opportunity to individuals who wish to obtain a higher education.

GILBERT F & MARY E ENDRES

This \$250 scholarship was established by Mr. & Mrs. Endres shortly before his death in the hope that they might increase educational opportunities for students.

GLENN SCOTT MEMORIAL

This scholarship is given to graduates of Era ISD. Recipients must be full-time students (12 semester hours). Criteria for selection are based on GPA. Valedictorians are not eligible. Scholarship award amount is \$300 per semester

Lynn Scott established this scholarship in memory of her husband. Glenn was a very giving person and was always willing to extend a helping hand. This scholarship continually honors his giving nature.

GUARANTY NATIONAL BANK

Recipients of this scholarship must maintain a college cumulative 2.0 GPA. Scholarship award amount is \$300 each semester.

**HOWARD & LELA SPRINGER
GENERAL ACADEMIC**

This scholarship is available to an academically talented student, but is not limited to any specific field of study. Recipients must maintain a 3.0 GPA in their major area of study. Scholarship award amount is \$250 per semester.

Mr. Springier served NCTC as a member of the Board of Regents. After his death Mrs. Springer established two scholarships in his name. She felt the best way to honor his service to the college was the gift of education to those who wanted it most.

JACK LEE GORDON

These scholarships are for academically talented students, with preference given to Montague County residents. Scholarship award amounts are \$250 per semester.

Faye Randall Gordon left property to the Foundation with the understanding that the proceeds from either sale or lease of the property be used to establish a scholarship in memory of Jack Lee Gordon, her son, who died in 1971.

JAMES & JOAN CANTWELL

This scholarship is to be awarded to full or part time students of the NCTC Bowie Campus. Students must maintain the minimum college cumulative grade point average of 2.0.

KERRY STANLEY MEMORIAL

Preference for this scholarship is given to students who major in Biology. Recipients must maintain a 2.5 cumulative GPA. Scholarship award amount is \$300 per semester.

**KIOWA WOMAN'S CLUB
ANICE RHODES MEMORIAL**

These special scholarships were established by the Kiowa Woman's Club in honor of Anice Rhodes and are open to women residents of Cooke County who are deserving of assistance. Recipients must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 hours, must provide a clearly defined career goal, and be following an established educational plan. In addition, recipients must maintain a 2.5 GPA. Scholarship award amounts are \$300 per semester.

KIWANIS CLUB OF LAKE KIOWA

These scholarships are to be awarded to students who live in the area served by the Callisburg ISD or are employees of either Lake Kiowa or Kiowa Homeowner's Water Supply Corporation who need financial assistance to attend NCTC... Scholarship award amounts are \$600 per semester for full-time students and \$300 per semester for part-time students.

MICKEY & HENRY SPAETH

This scholarship is reserved for an academically talented student. Recipients must maintain 2.5 GPA. Scholarship award amount is \$250 per semester.

Mr. & Mrs. Spaeth saw the value of higher education in today's world. This scholarship was established to assist in removing some of the financial barriers student's face while striving for a higher education.
