



#### **Fall Enrollment Head Count**




### Fall Enrollment by Campus




## Percentage of Enrollment by Campus




# Fall Enrollment by Age Distribution



### **Enrollment by Gender**













### **Enrollment** by Tuition Status














### **Retention Status**




### Full-Time Equivalent Students








