Program Description

In this Occupational Skills Award (OSA) program, instruction provides training as a caregiver to provide hands-on basic care of residents in a variety of healthcare settings. This program requires 100 contact hours, which includes 60 hours of Lecture/Lab hours and 40 hours of Clinical Externship.. Tuition includes lab supplies, textbooks, materials, and the state certification exam. Upon successful completion of this program, you may earn a priority point toward admission into an NCTC Nursing program.
