
- **Photo ID:** To be admitted to your testing session, you will need to present proper photo identification, such as a driver's license, passport, or green card.
 - **ATI Login Information:** Test takers who do not have their ATI username and password, will not be able to take the exam.
 - **Writing Instrument:** Two sharpened No. 2 pencils with attached erasers. No other writing instruments are allowed.
 - **You will not be allowed to test if you arrive to the testing center late.**
- **Please know that you may only take the TEAS three times in a calendar year.**

POINTS REQUIREMENT FOR ADMISSION (Applicants will be ranked according to points)

Anatomy & Physiology I	A = 4 Pts	B = 3 Pts	C = 2 Pts
Anatomy & Physiology II	A = 4 Pts	B = 3 Pts	C = 2 Pts

MAX TOTAL: 8 POINTS

Deductions: One point will be deducted for each withdrawal or retake to improve a grade in either A&P course.

TEAS TEST SCORES (Applicants can take the TEAS a maximum of 3 times per calendar year).

TEAS Exams can be taken in-person or remotely.

Applicants must score **at least 50%** in each section to qualify. Points awarded per section based on percentage:

Reading	>90=5	>80=4	>70=3	>60=2	>50=1
Math	>90=5	>80=4	>70=3	>60=2	>50=1
Science	>90=5	>80=4	>70=3	>60=2	>50=1
Writing	>90=5	>80=4	>70=3	>60=2	>50=1
